

Application 2016 Montana Conservation and Fly Fishing Camp

Montana Trout Unlimited invites twenty kids (between ages 11 and 14) to join volunteers and professionals July 17-21, 2016 to learn about fly fishing, fly tying, watershed management, native fish and more at Camp Watanopa on the banks of Georgetown Lake. Field trips to Upper Rock Creek, Flint Creek and a fish hatchery tour are included. Montana TU provides all fishing equipment and classroom supplies during the camp.

We are looking for motivated individuals who are excited about learning from experts on water quality, stream restoration, aquatic insects and coldwater fisheries. Students do not need to know how to fly fish, but must be willing to learn. In recent years, we have had an approximate mix of two-to-one boys to girls, whose experience has ranged from beginner to intermediate.

The fee is \$300 to attend, which includes all meals and lodging. Scholarships may be available if needed.
